MINUTES OF THE NATIONAL STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING OF PMKVY-TI HELD ON 9TH AUGUST 2018 AT MINISTRY OF HRD, SHASTRI BHAVAN, NEW DELHI

The 4th Meeting of the National Screening Committee of PMKVY-TI was held in MHRD, Shastri Bhawan at 4.30pm on 9th August, 2018. Secretary (HE) chaired the meeting. The following were present:

2. Director, AICTE made a presentation on the progress of the programme so far undertaken. It has been stated that out of the 26,447 candidates enrolled in the AY 2016-17. so far 12,229 were certified and 2,852 were found placement. The following points emerged in the discussion that ensued:

- a) The enrolment and drop out figures for 2016-17 and 2017-18 showed a significant dropout rate of trainees compared to the original enrolment. Although the dropout rate improved in 2017-18, it was decided that the factors causing a high dropout, viz, improper mobilisation of right candidates, delays in assessment eroding course credibility and over dependence on the institutions themselves to mobilise trainees, should be correctively addressed by involving the functionaries of the State/District level involved in skilling, to assist in identification.
- b) National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) may be addressed, giving full break-up of institutions and sectors where assessments are pending, urging expeditious action to complete the assessments.
- c) In view of the larger scale of skilling activity conducted in 2017-18 and likely in the current year, Secretary (MOSDE) may be requested to create an alternative assessment route by conducting a TOT for all training institutions, after which their capacities may be raised to carry out assessments on their own and obtain certification from the concerned SSC. Since the training institutions are all engineering colleges offering B.Tech degrees, it would not be difficult for them to develop capacity to carry out the assessments on their own. Wherever CBSE has the capacity for assessment, it was decided that they would be used in larger measure.
- d) The date of assessment shall be fixed on the date of commencement of course itself, so that there is adequate time for mobilisation and eliminate assessment delays.

e) Mobilisation of candidates needs special attention in the current year with the right IEC activities, awareness workshops and video conferencing with the District Collectors/Skill Officers.

3. The proposal for running the programme for 2018-19 was examined along with the revised criteria adopted for selection and filtering of institutions. The Steering Committee has, thereafter, approved the intake of **3,71,025 students in 1,719 engineering colleges and other professional colleges for the year 2018-19** (Annexure-A) with the following conditions:

- a) The first batch of the PMKVY-TI, 2018-19 shall be started on 1st October, 2018. The second batch could commence from 1st January 2019 and this could be announced before hand, while closing the window for 1st October, 2018. The second batch, wherever permitted, shall be allowed only after completion of one batch.
- b) The proposal of Telecom Sector Skill Council to undertake training of 1.13 lakh students was evaluated and an intake of 63,725 students across 451 institutions was approved.
- c) The use of **Aadhar based biometrics** for attendance shall be used. Every institution shall try the system before taking a batch.
- d) The fund release would be linked to **Aadhar based attendance**.
- e) There shall be a maximum timeline of 06 months for QPs with duration 250-400 hours, and duration of 09 months for QPs with 400-600 hours.
- f) The matter of integration of AICTE portal with SDMS portal of NSDC would be pursued with NSDC, so that the institutions get over the current delays faced while asking SSCs for assessment. Proper APIs would be developed for integration of data between AICTE and MoSDE, in a given time frame.
- g) The issue of additional requirement of funds would be examined based on the enrolment numbers on 1st October 2018. The release of balance funds for the current batches would be expedited by MHRD so as to enable smooth continuation of the programme.
- 4. Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
